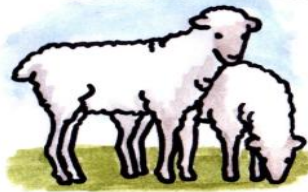
Answer to Word Puzzle: GOOD SHEPHERD

Encouragement

Can we hear Christ’s voice speaking to us today?

Can we hear Christ’s voice speaking to us today? Or are we like those who, recognizing God’s intention to gather the whole world into his fold, were filled with jealousy and deaf to the Good News? We may have moments where we can hear, and moments where distractions deafen us to our shepherd’s voice. Let us pray for new hearts and open ears to follow Christ.

In the first reading, Paul and Barnabas speak to the people in the synagogue. At first the people are receptive, but later some Jews are filled with jealousy at seeing *the crowds*. Consequently, Paul and Barnabas evangelize the Gentiles, who are delighted and glorify the Lord. In the second reading, John writes of his vision where a multitude have washed their robes in the blood of the lamb who shepherds them. In the Gospel, Jesus says that his sheep hear his voice and that he and the Father are one.
