A Minute with Jesus: The Eucharist and the Most Holy Trinity – Father, Son and Holy Spirit. Jesus gave His life for us so that our sins can be forgiven and we can be united in a relationship of love with the Father, Son and Holy Spirit. We refer to the Father, Son and Holy Spirit as the most Holy Trinity – three Persons in one God. 

HOLY TRINITY - SOLEMNITY

The Church invites us to explore humbly the mystery of the Most Holy Trinity and to grapple with the truths of this fundamental insight into the essence of God's being. The three Persons of the Holy Trinity – Father, Son, and Holy Spirit – are one, but are distinct from each other. Thus, we can say they are in relationship with one another – an eternal communion of love. Confronted with this mystery, let us contemplate with wonder and awe the beauty of God. In the first reading, the wisdom of God speaks of being present when the Lord established the heavens, beside him as his craftsman. In the Epistle Paul writes, we have peace with God through our Lord Jesus Christ, and that the Holy Spirit has been given to us. In the Gospel, Jesus tells his disciples that the Spirit of truth will guide them to all truth, declaring to them everything that is his.

Building Update: The council has accepted a bid from Krause Konstruction to tuck point the entire building. The cost for this will be \$48,680. It was also decided to move ahead with our basement renovation that is part of our Inspired by the Spirit Campaign. This project will cost \$25,740 to replace the floor with Legacy Concrete Coatings. We also plan to paint the walls. It is looking like this will happen mid-July. Help will be needed to move EVERYTHING from the basement before this project starts. We will need help from all parishioners for this!!! If anybody is willing to donate towards these projects, we would greatly appreciate it so that we don't deplete a large portion of our maintenance budget. Please place donations in a marked envelope & place in the offertory.

Conforming Hearts to Christ the High Priest: On June 28, three men will stand before the Church to receive the sacrament of holy orders, drawn into the eternal priesthood of Jesus Christ. Through prayer and the laying on of hands, they will be configured to Christ the High Priest, entrusted with His ministry of word and sacrament.
