Message for the week of June 8:

A Minute with Jesus: The Holy Spirit and the Eucharist Even after the Apostles had experienced the Risen Christ, they were afraid. They gathered with Mary on the day of Pentecost and prayed behind locked doors, waiting as instructed for the Gift of the Holy Spirit. After the Holy Spirit descended upon them on Pentecost, the Apostles were no longer afraid and were equipped to fulfill their role in bringing others to Jesus and His Church. It is the same for us today. When we receive the Eucharist, we also receive God the Holy Spirit, to abide in the depths of our hearts. If we allow Him, the Spirit of Truth will transform us and we will no longer be afraid, but be equipped with peace and strength for our role in God's plan. Let us then prepare for each Eucharistic encounter in the same way the Apostles prepared for Pentecost, "in prayer ... with Mary ..." (Acts 1:14).

<u>March for Life Wisconsin</u>: The 2025 March for Life Wisconsin will take place on Saturday, June 14 at 2 PM at the Wisconsin State Capitol, hosted by the Wisconsin Catholic Conference, Pro-Life Wisconsin, Wisconsin Right to Life, and Wisconsin Family Council. Buses to the March will travel from around the state, including from Chippewa Falls, Onalaska, and Sparta. The feast of Pentecost came nine days after Jesus had ascended into Heaven. The disciples and Mary were praying together when the



PENTECOST SUNDAY

Let us ask the Lord to give us hearts that are docile to the work of the Spirit in us. The Holy Spirit transformed the disciples into courageous witnesses of the Resurrection of our Lord. It is this same Spirit that we have received at baptism and whose fullness is given to us at confirmation so that, like those first disciples, we might build up the Church. But submitting to the power of the Holy Spirit can be challenging and we can be tempted to resist. Let us ask the Lord to give us hearts that are docile to the work of the Spirit in us.

In the first reading, the Holy Spirit descends upon the disciples with a powerful sound and upon each one in tongues as of fire. Filled with this Spirit, they begin to speak about God's works in different languages so that visitors to Jerusalem are able to understand them. Paul writes about the way the Holy Spirit animates and unites the members of the Body of Christ. In the Gospel, Jesus appears to his disciples, blesses them with his peace, and empowers them with the Holy Spirit to forgive and retain sins.

Building Update: The council has accepted a bid from Krause Konstruction to tuck point the entire building. The cost for this will be \$48,680. It was also decided to move ahead with our basement renovation that is part of our Inspired by the Spirit Campaign. This project will cost \$25,740 to replace the floor with Legacy Concrete Coatings. We also plan to paint the walls. It is looking like this will happen mid-July. Help will be needed to move EVERYTHING from the basement before this project starts. We will need help from all parishioners for this!!! If anybody is willing to donate towards these projects, we would greatly appreciate it so that we don't deplete a large portion of our maintenance budget.
