In today's Gospel reading, the disciples asked Jesus to teach them how to pray, so He taught them the "Our Father."


Father" we give glory to God by

Seventeenth Sunday in Ordinary Time

In our Gospel reading from Luke, some of Jesus's disciples ask our Lord to teach them how to pray. Jesus immediately gives them the beautiful prayer, which we, of course, call the Our Father. The Our Father is truly a prayer of stewardship. In it, we intimately call upon God as Father. We ask that His will be done (not ours!) and that His kingdom come (not ours!). In other words, we remember that He is our Creator, and everything belongs to Him. Our focus in life should be on His priorities, not our own. Then we ask Him to supply our needs (to give us our daily bread), forgive our sins, and protect us from evil. That is, we proclaim our complete trust in His provision for us and His mercy towards us. We, too, have the responsibility to extend mercy ourselves, as we forgive those who sin against us.

As we pray the words of the Our Father, we acknowledge this fundamental truth about ourselves and God: God is our Father, and we are beloved and infinitely blessed to be His children. This forms the foundation of a stewardship lifestyle. At the end of the Gospel passage, Jesus encourages us to build a relationship with the Father: Ask Him, seek Him, and knock on His door!

He eagerly anticipates blessing us, His children. Keep this in mind throughout the week; then go out and be a source of blessing to others! Stewardship is as joyous and straightforward as that.
