Stewardship Reflection

Today's readings set a high standard for us Christian stewards, reminding us that a stewardship way of life is meant to be a challenging way of life.

In the second reading from the Letter to the Hebrews, we are told to live as Christ lived. And how did Christ live? "For the sake of the joy that lay before Him, He endured the cross." If we are tempted to complain about the sufferings we must endure as Christ's disciples, we are told, "In your struggle against sin you have not yet resisted to the point of shedding blood." In other words, "If you're not bleeding, what are you complaining about?" That is quite a high bar!

The Gospel reading from Luke continues with this challenging theme. Our Lord tells His disciples, "I have come to set the earth on fire, and how I wish it were already blazing." A few verses later, Jesus adds, "Do you think that I have come to establish peace on the earth? No, I tell you, but rather division."

Jesus's life on this earth and the message He brought weren't meant to simply make us feel good. His words can sometimes make us feel uncomfortable. That's because His Good News (and it truly is good news!) is intended to transform us, to make saints out of us.

The stewardship way of life sets a high standard indeed. However, when fully embraced, this way of life, focused on God and others, will help us become the saints we are called to be.
