

The Commemoration of All the Faithful Departed (All Souls)

On All Souls Day, the Church unites in prayer for all who have gone before us, marked with the sign of faith. The Scriptures remind us of the hope we all share in Christ. The Book of Wisdom assures us that "the souls of the just are in the hand of God" (Wis 3:1), while St. Paul teaches that through Baptism, we were all united with Christ in His death so that we might also live with Him forever (Rom 6:3-9).

In today's Gospel, Jesus offers us words of profound comfort and promise: "Everyone who sees the Son and believes in Him may have eternal life, and I shall raise him on the last day" (Jn 6:40). This promise of eternal life, God's greatest gift to us, shapes the way we live today, giving us comfort and security.

As Christian stewards, we are called to use the time, talents, and treasure entrusted to us in ways that prepare us for eternity. A Christian steward recognizes that everything we have is a gift from God and is responsible for managing these gifts wisely. Each day offers an opportunity to serve God, love our neighbor, and share the gift of faith with others.

As we pray for the faithful departed today, may we also renew our own commitment to live as disciples who wisely use the gifts we have received. This could mean spending our time volunteering for those in need, using our talents to serve the church community, and offering our treasure to support those less fortunate. In doing so, we prepare ourselves to share in the fullness of life with Christ, who has promised to raise us on the last day.
