A sacrament is an outward sign of a grace that God gives us in our soul. When we are baptized, water is poured on our head as a symbol of the sin being washed out of our soul.





The Feast of the Baptism of the Lord

Today marks the close of the Christmas season, but before we return to Ordinary Time, we have one more great feast to celebrate — The Baptism of the Lord. Today's feast is a perfect opportunity to reflect on the privileges and responsibilities we all share as Christian stewards by virtue of our Baptism.

At our Baptism, we became adopted sons and daughters of God and members of His Holy Catholic Church. Unknowingly, this moment also marks the beginning of our journey as Christian stewards, disciples of Jesus Christ, called to follow His example and share the Gospel message daily.

In our second reading from the Acts of the Apostles, St. Peter offers a glimpse of Jesus, whom we should imitate. "He went about doing good and healing all those oppressed by the devil, for God was with him." This should inspire us to follow Jesus' example of doing good to everyone we meet.

In the Gospel passage from Matthew, we see Jesus humbly standing before John for baptism. His act of humility and willingness to unite Himself to us invites us to reflect on our own humility and desire to serve as His disciples in daily life.

And when we do strive with all our might to live out our Baptismal call to Christian stewardship, we will experience the profound honor of knowing that we, too, are God's "beloved" sons and daughters "with whom He is well-pleased."
